Dearly Departed: Death & Dying in Montgomery County

Dearly Departed: Death & Dying in Montgomery County explores how families have dealt with the death of a loved one. The exhibit tells the story of the people, businesses, and places that support individuals and their families at such times. Come learn about the growth of area funeral homes, changes in burial traditions, and ways we've grieved over the past 200 years.

The exhibit will feature mourning attire and jewelry, a c1900 wicker removal basket, spirit photographs, and more. A companion exhibit at the Crawfordsville District Public Library will feature the life and work of Sidney Speed, a local monument designer and expert carver.

The public is invited to celebrate this new exhibit with an opening reception from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm on Thursday, March 21, at the Carnegie Museum. Light refreshments will be served.

At 7:00 pm, immediately following the reception, the museum will host the **Annual Meeting of the Membership of the Friends of the Carnegie Museum of Montgomery County**. Museum members will hear details about the museum's activities in 2023, vote on the slate of incoming board members, and get a sneak peak into what's coming in 2024. All museum members are welcome and encouraged to attend.

The Carnegie Museum is wheelchair and stroller accessible, and admission is free. Regular visiting hours are Wednesday through Saturday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.



2023 Annual Report

The Carnegie Museum of Montgomery County had wonderfully busy, record-setting year in 2023. We welcomed **9,137 visitors,** our highest annual attendance to date, and we hosted many exciting programs, exhibits, and events.

The national traveling exhibit *The Amazing Castle* was the talk of the town, delighting our regular patrons while introducing the museum to many new families. Thanks to a grant from the Montgomery County Community Foundation, we were able to extend its run in our community to a full eight months, twice what most locations are able to host, as well as to offer a number of related programs, including a professional storyteller and kids' theater workshop. Also featured in the spring was the exhibit *Crinoids of Montgomery County*, and then in the fall, we unveiled our newest local history exhibit, *Unequal and Undaunted: Education and Community at Lincoln School for Colored Children*. To round out the year, we celebrated the fine arts with two art shows: *The Magic of Water* and *Crawfordsville Schools Art Extravaganza*.

On the educational programming side, **Pi Day, Castles & Coding, Eclipse Central, The Science of Brains & Bodies**, and **School Break Science** all drew nice crowds to the museum, offering families hands-on learning and demonstrations. We also kept kids busy in both summer and winter with our annual **Summer at the Museum** and **Photos with Santa** events.

In addition to all of this, the Carnegie Museum welcomed numerous preschool and elementary school field trips, homeschool groups, local organizations, and several author book signings, as well as visitors from all over the United States and the world. It was a great year for us, and we can't wait to do it all again in 2024!



Professional and amateur artists are welcome to submit work for consideration. Works will be returned to the artist at the conclusion of the exhibit in October 2024. Artists should send images of their art to Janna Bennett at jbennett.carnegie@cdpl.lib.in.us or call 765-362-4622 to make an appointment to show the work during a virtual meeting or to make other arrangements to view potential art work. Submission deadline is July 1, 2024. A decision will be made by the curatorial team by the end of July on the selection of art to be included, and the show will launch with an opening reception on August 24, 2024.
