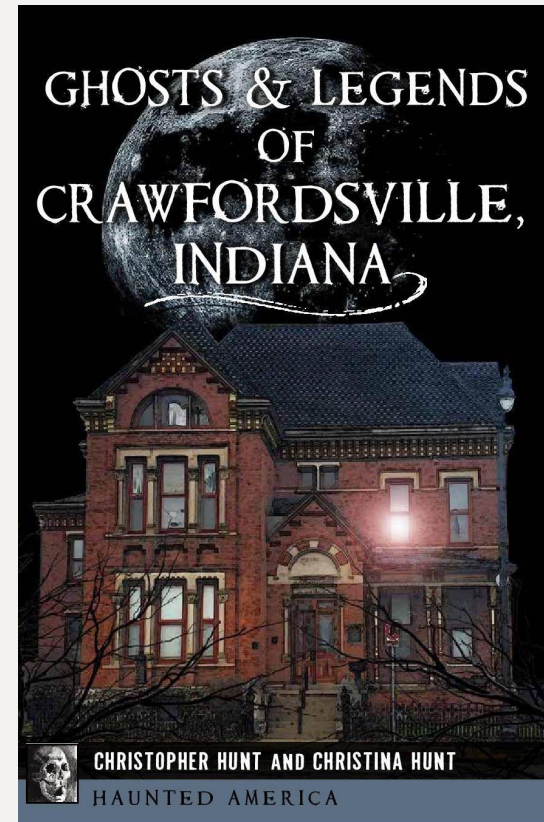

Vory Brookshire Had the Future Revealed to Him Before the Election.
